# Key Headlines\*

Occupancy, average room rate (ARR) and Revenue per available room (RevPAR) were all up on the same period of 2017:

At 74.9%, the average occupancy rate in the WMCA area during May 2018 was 1% higher compared with occupancy recorded in May 2017

The average room rate recorded for the month was £1.5 higher compared with the figure recorded in the previous year.

Revenue per available room (RevPAR) was £52.8 in May 2018. £1.9 up on the figure recorded in May 2017.

However all three indicators were still below the national average:

- Occupancy was 4% below the UK regional average (i.e. the UK excluding London) of 79%.
- At £70.4 the average room rate was below the UK regional average of £74.55.
- RevPAR was £6.13 below the UK regional average of £58.93.



# **Occupancy Rates**


### **WMCA Area Analysis**

At 74.9%, the average occupancy rate in the WMCA area during May 2018 was 1% higher compared with occupancy recorded in May 2017, but was 4% below UK regional average (i.e. the UK excluding London) of 79%.



### **Detailed Area Analysis**


Year-on-year comparison shows that occupancy rates in May were up in all areas except in the Coventry and Warwickshire LEP area. Hotels located in the Black Country enjoyed the biggest rise of occupancy compared with the same period last year.



# **Average Room Rates**


### **WMCA Area Analysis**

The average room rate recorded for the month was £1.5 higher compared with the figure recorded in the previous year. At £70.4, this was below the UK regional average of £74.55.



### **Detailed Area Analysis**


At £72.8, Greater Birmingham and Solihull LEP area has had the highest average room rate in May compared with the other two LEP areas in the Combined Authority Area.




### Revenue Per Available Room

### **WMCA Area Analysis**

Revenue per available room (RevPAR) was £52.8 in May 2018 - £6.13 below the UK regional average of £58.93. £1.9 up on the figure recorded in May 2017.



Encouragingly, RevPAR was up in all three LEP areas compared with the same period last year. In the Coventry and Warwickshire LEP area, driven by a modest rise in ARR, RevPAR was up by 2.8% despite a slight drop in number of rooms sold.



# **Detailed Market Analysis**

### The business and leisure markets

Leisure tourism market enjoyed a strong May but business tourism market suffered a slight decline:

- The weekday occupancy rate in May 2018 (largely driven by business visitors) was down by 3% on May 2017 from 79.6% to 76.9%. RevPAR was also down by 2% to £55.76.
- The weekend occupancy rate, (largely driven by leisure visitors) was 79.5% up by 1% on the previous year. At £55.89, the weekend RevPAR rate was also up by 6% compared with May 2017.

## **Star-rating Analysis**

Year on year comparison shows that both high and low end hotels saw a small rise in their ARR and RevPAR. However high end hotels saw a small drop in their occupancy rates from 76.4% in 2017 to 75.2% in 2018.
